PFS Region 2 Program	1/1/24 -12/31/24	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The Region 2 PFS program hosted a regional conference with over 100 youth participants, focusing primarily on community advocacy.</li><li>• The PFS coordinator assisted with the statewide conference and helped re-launch the campaign during the event.</li><li>• Additionally, the PFS coordinator collaborated closely with the Lee County Coop. Clinic and the Marianna Mayor's Office to organize community events, including A.T.O.D. Free Friday Nights Done Right, a Senior Citizens Expo, Safety Day, and more.</li><li>• During Red Ribbon Week, over 1,500 prevention materials were distributed, making a significant effort in information dissemination.</li></ul>

Region 3 RPP Program	1/1/24 -12/31/24	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Staff set up educational booths at County Fairs, and Health Fairs for youth and Senior Citizens, along with Great American smoke out event within our ten-county coverage area.</li> <li>• Staff hosted 2 conferences with guest speakers- from different cultures and back grounds (Indigence Tribes and African Americans).</li> <li>• Hosted Prescription Take Back Events in 4 Counties 2x's year.</li> <li>• Collaborated with County coalitions for task force meetings and CJI-on round table events.</li> <li>• Staff collaborated with DEA and other guest speakers to give presentations at schools during Red Ribbon Week.</li> <li>• Gave presentations at Senior Citizens Centers, Rotary, ACC, faith-based communities and disseminated 41,444 educational materials along with 4909 school supplies and 8164 promotional items. Completed 21 SYNAR checks in all ten counties and recruited 44 schools to complete APNA. Hosted Narcan Trainings and disseminated 587 Narcan kits.</li> <li>• Staff use social media platform (Face Book), radio, television, Newspaper advertisement, tabletop advertisement to each a total of 6,181,462 population in ten counties within a 12-month period.</li> <li>• Staff members were able to rebuild coalitions in Van Buren and White County.</li> <li>• Staff volunteers' hours at food banks feed low income and working community clean ups.</li> </ul>

Region 7 RPP Program	1/1/24 -12/31/24	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Region 7 RPP Program hosted events and a regional conference that primarily focused on harm reduction and community-based processes, impacting 267 participants.</li> <li>• The RPP coordinator assisted with initiatives from Mid-South and DAABHS to conduct APNA participation surveys, SYNAR compliance checks, Prescription Drug Take Backs, Narcan Projects, and Red Ribbon Week. Utilization of the SPF Guide was used to perform daily tasks and organize Safety Day/Fun Days, back to school drives, Stop the Violence events and workshops with organizations like Men of Action, Freedom for Youth, Americans for Action, and the Cross Co Hometown Health Coalition.</li> <li>• To promote education and awareness the program distributed 6150 Red ribbon week materials, 4183 promotional items and nearly 12000 prevention education pamphlets and cards.</li> </ul>

NE Project Prevent	1/1/24 -12/31/24	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• From January to December 2024, the NE Region Project Prevent program significantly expanded its reach and impact across communities.</li><li>• We engaged over 2,000 individuals through school presentations, community outreach, and new innovative programs.</li><li>• Notable accomplishments include launching “Real Talk: Questions from a Fishbowl,” an interactive youth-led discussion series, and supporting the Paragould School District in integrating a Saturday School program for students caught vaping or possessing tobacco products.</li><li>• Additionally, a new partnership with Rivercrest School District allowed us to provide staff training on tobacco prevention and deliver presentations in large group settings, small groups, and one-on-one interventions for students in need.</li><li>• Through these efforts, we’ve strengthened education prevention and empowered students to make healthier choices.</li></ul>

However, our experience with our first event, "The Great Smoke Out," significantly boosted our confidence in engaging with the community and encouraging participation in the program.</li> <li>• Throughout the year, we successfully connected with over 1,000 individuals through a variety of outreach efforts, including school visits, event participation, and outreach across different counties. Notably, in January, we had the opportunity to participate in an event at the Olly Neal Clinic in Marianna. The turnout was impressive, and we were able to register two new chapters while engaging with a significant portion of the community in Lee County.</li> <li>• Looking ahead, we are committed to expanding the program further into additional counties and making a lasting, positive impact on the lives of youth in our region. We are excited about the potential to continue building momentum and increasing our outreach efforts in the coming months.</li> </ul>

CRDC has connected with several youth led organizations in the school districts of Craighead and Greene Counties to educate students and faculty about tobacco use and vaping.</li> <li>• CRDC was able to successfully disseminate cessation information to over 50 businesses and non - profit organizations. Through these efforts, CRDC has been able to make an impact, educate, and empower students and the community to make healthy choices.</li> </ul>
